# Preface

Early child development plays a key role in the development potential of societies. It contributes decisively to the Millennium Development Goal of poverty reduction as well as to development objectives in the sectors of health and education. However, until now the importance of early child development is hardly reflected in concrete measures of development cooperation. The earliest years in life and prenatal conditions are of crucial significance for human development. Growing up under conditions of poverty can hamper child development decisively and have lifelong irreversible consequences.

The conference's aim is to highlight the importance of early child development for human development in general and for poverty reduction. On the other hand, what are the consequences of poverty for human development and what are possible strategies to avoid the negative consequences? How can children with disabilities, living under poor circumstances, be identified and supported at a very early stage and, if available, be included in general early childhood programs?

These are the guiding questions which will be dealt with at this conference. In addition the conference will take a closer look at Community Based Rehabilitation and the role it can play to fortify early child development within the framework of development cooperation.
